there, a 1904 Schacht that was made in Ohio. It had high wood-spoked red wheels, a radiator where the traces used to be and a tiny two-cylinder engine in the back covered by a black enameled piece of plywood.

Daniels, who also owns a Stanley Steamer a couple of Model A Fords and several unrestored cars, says he does it for the "history of it" and it's just plain fun to drive them.

been discussing with them a partially, self-funded employee benefit program.

Roebuck told the commission Aetna Insurance is giving them an 18 percent across the board rate hike. The county paid \$145,621 in premiums between October, 1982, and July 1, 1983. Aetna paid \$43,827 in claims, according to Roebuck. He says the county will save a minimum of \$29,545 by changing to his plan.

Aetna representatives are scheduled to meet with com-

missioners later this month, said County Clerk Marjorie Williams.

The commission also today briefly discussed a health program for county employees proposed by Newton Memorial Hospital officials.
